We are a nonprofit whose focus is on providing career-connected learning experiences to high schoolers across the country. Our role is to ensure all students are fairly paid, have a safe virtual working environment and are supported throughout their internships.







Review the steps below to learn more about your internship, supported by Work-Based Learning Alliance.



1) TELL US ABOUT YOURSELF

Complete the Intern Interest Inventory to let WBLA know your areas of interests, industry preferences, and schedule availability.

2) CONNECT WITH YOUR ADVISOR

Your WBLA advisor will help you get ready for your internship, and be your first point of contact should you need anything throughout your internship experience.





3) MAKE IT OFFICIAL

You will complete all your onboarding paperwork through WBLA so that you are ready to start your internship and get paid!

4) GET ON BOARD

Attend an onboarding session to learn all about your internship experience, meet your intern team, and say hello to your industry sponsor.





5) WORK IT

Work as part of an intern consulting team to solve a real business challenge for your industry sponsor. WBLA internships are completely virtual, so you don't have to worry about finding a ride (or catching the bus!) to connect with your coworkers.

6) BUILD YOUR PROFESSIONAL SKILLS Build your skills by working on a valuable project,

observing business meetings, and getting feedback on your progress from your industry sponsor. Your typical schedule will require 10-15 hours per week of your time.





7) PRESENT YOUR FINAL PRODUCT

You and your teammates will present your final project solution to your industry sponsor. This presentation will demonstrate all the work your team has done throughout your internship.

8) CELEBRATE!

Congratulations! You have completed your internship, something that truly sets you apart from your peers. Now it's time to share your accomplishment on your resume and platforms such as LinkedIn.





When do the internships take place?

October 15 - November 22

January 21 - March 21 (no meetings during February vacation)

March 3 - April 11

June 30 - July 25

July 28 - August 22

How will I be paid?

Work-Based Learning Alliance will pay interns \$1500 over the course of the 100 hour internship. The pay schedule will vary based on the length of the internship.

Please note that you must have a Social Security Nunber in order to be paid.

What is expected of me as an intern?

You will complete 100 hours of work virtually over the course of your internship. Your exact schedule will vary based on the length of your internship and your industry mentor's availability. You will work with a team of interns, some of whom may be from other schools. You will spend your time working on a project that you and your teammates will ultimately present to your industry mentor. Your internship will be spent conducting research on your project, working with your team on your final deliverable, and meeting with your WBLA advisor and industry mentor.

What's Next

- Talk with your family and school about whether an internship will fit into your schedule this year.
