


# What is the MyView Literacy Curriculum?

myView Reading Workshop immerses students in various genres of text, while building knowledge within a unit theme, along with vocabulary and comprehension strategies.









In myView Writing Workshop, students learn to communicate ideas with pictures and text, as they learn skills and strategies to grow as writers.

### What is the Fundations Curriculum?

Fundations word study program provides students a strong foundation for reading and writing. Through explicit lessons and routines, Fundations builds:

- Phonological awareness skills
- Letter/Sound mastery
- Reading and spelling words with a VC pattern (e.g. log, mat)
- High frequency word recognition
- Handwriting.
